# National Institutes of Health (NIH) AREA R15



The purpose of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Academic Research Enhancement Award (AREA) for Undergraduate-Focused Institutions is to support small scale research grants at institutions that do not receive substantial funding from the NIH, with an emphasis on providing biomedical research experiences primarily for undergraduate students and enhancing the research environment at applicant institutions. An AREA grant should: (1) provide support for meritorious research at undergraduate-focused institutions or institutional components; (2) strengthen the research environment at these institutions/components; and (3) give undergraduate students an opportunity to gain significant biomedical research experience through active involvement in the research. Full proposal applications are due annually on June 25, October 25, and February 25. The next round of applications is due February 25, 2022. For more information please, click here.

#### **U.S. Department of Education Fulbright-Hays Grants**



The Fulbright-Hays Group Projects Abroad (GPA) program is designed to promote, improve, and develop modern foreign language training and area studies programs for all levels of American education. The program provides opportunities for faculty, teachers, and undergraduate and graduate students to conduct individual and group projects overseas. Projects may include short-term seminars, curriculum development, group research or study, or long-term advanced intensive language programs. Projects must focus on one or more of the following areas: Africa, East Asia, South Asia, Southeast Asia and the Pacific, the Western Hemisphere (Central and South America, Mexico, and the Caribbean), East Central Europe and Eurasia, and the Near East. The Fulbright-Hays Seminars Abroad—Bilateral Projects Program supports short-term study and travel seminars abroad for U.S. educators in the social sciences, humanities, and the arts for the purpose of improving their understanding and knowledge of the peoples and cultures of other nations. For the FY22 competition, seminars will be offered to post-secondary faculty and administrators in Norway, and to secondary and post-secondary career and technical professionals and policymakers in Germany. The nature of this program is for participants to partake in a pre-arranged, structured academic and travel program. Due to the group nature of the seminar and the requirement that participants attend all scheduled activities, participants will not have time to engage in extensive individual research.
