

Targeted Grants in Mathematics and Physical Sciences: On A Rolling Basis

<u>Targeted Grants in MPS</u> supports high-risk theoretical mathematics, physics and computer sciences projects. Proposals should have exceptional promise and scientific importance. **Period of performance and funding level is dependent on the scope of work and what is appropriate for the proposal.** Indirect costs are limited to 20% of applicable direct costs. **Letter of Intent & Proposal both have a rolling deadline.**

Public Engagement with Historical Records: Due 2 NOV 2023

<u>The Public Engagement with Historical Records from the National Archives</u> supports programs with a strong focus on public engagement with historical records. The grant opportunity has an emphasis on forming collaboration among archivists, educators, historians, and people working in community-based archives to better engage with the public. It funds projects between \$50,000 to \$150,000 with cost share. The application deadline is November 2, 2023.

Secondary Analysis of Posttraumatic Psychopathology Date: DUE 8 JAN 2025

The Secondary Analysis of Posttraumatic Psychopathology Data from the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH) is looking for research proposals to analyze existing and accumulating data to aid in refining phenotypes of posttraumatic psychopathology(ies), markers of onset and change, and risk detection. NIMH is also interested in research using available data to identify potential prevention and treatment targets and to advance and refine measurement and validation of potential novel targets for future development in experimental therapeutics research. The proposal deadline is January 8, 2025.

ARTS

Arts Project Support Grant: Due 4 MAR 2024

The Arts Project Support Grants from the South Carolina Arts Commission supports artists, organizations, and units of governments for arts related projects. This includes, projects, programs, build/increase capacity technically, online, and virtually, public art spaces, community arts development, and professional development for artists and arts administration staff. The grant funds up to \$2,500 per fiscal year with 1:1 cost share for organization and 1:2 for artists. The application deadline is March 4, 2024.
